## Pfizer COVID-19 Vaccine Booster

A clinic for Independent Living residents to receive Pfizer COVID-19 vaccine boosters will be held on Tuesday, October 26, in Cochrane Commons. Residents of the Tower, Garden and The Glebe are asked to come between 8 a.m.-noon. Courtyard and Homes on the Green residents should come between noon-5 p.m. If you are not able to come during the assigned times, please report to the Cochrane Commons when you are able, and every attempt will made to accommodate you. Resident information will be uploaded electronically and securely. Please remember this is for residents who previously received the Pfizer vaccination, not Moderna or Johnson & Johnson. Residents must bring their vaccination cards. Boosters are strongly encouraged for everyone who achieved full vaccination status more than six months ago. This clinic is provided by Walgreens. Residents will receive a reminder in their boxes tomorrow.

If you have already received a third dose, please bring the card to the Clinic or email the details to Laurie Youndt, Director Clinical Services, so it can be added to your medical record.

### Resident Satisfaction Survey

The Resident Satisfaction Survey will begin November 1 for all areas of Westminster Canterbury. It will be conducted by Holleran. Written surveys will be placed in Independent Living boxes on November 1.
