### Coronavirus Updates

In great news, Westminster Canterbury Richmond is not aware of any active cases of COVID-19 in employees and residents. A few people have shown symptoms and are in quarantine awaiting test results.

On Tuesday, we held a one-day Pfizer booster shot clinic for employees and Independent Living residents along with our partner Walgreens. Approximately 400 people received boosters. Thank you for your patience with the occasional long wait times. Boosters were already given in Parsons Health Center and Assisted Living. Today, we hosted a mini clinic for residents to receive the Moderna booster.

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) positivity rate for Henrico County is currently 5.96%. Please stay vigilant in keeping one another safe and healthy.

### Vibrancy! and Other Construction Updates

Construction on the Parking Deck and Promenade continues. The construction team will be working on the Parking Deck on Saturdays for the coming weeks.

### Horticulture Updates

Fall flower installation began the week of October 11 with installation of violas, dusty miller and our beloved snapdragons. Planting in the remaining areas, including the Campbell Garden, The Gables gardens and the container gardens at the entrances to the building, will begin next week.

James River Nurseries will begin plantings in the West Courtyard beginning Tuesday. The plant layout will include New Generation Boxwood – a new variety that has more resistance to Boxwood Blight with a manageable growth rate. We have recently used this variety at the Cochrane Pond with great success. Other new plantings include Viburnum, Spirea, Hydrangeas and Azaleas along with native grasses and perennials. Our goal is to incorporate low maintenance plantings that will provide seasonal interest and promote pollinators throughout the year. We anticipate the plant installation work to continue into November. Sod installation will be the last phase of this project. Thank you, Courtyard residents, for your patience and understanding as this project has progressed.

There was a main line leak for the irrigation system sourced from the Cochrane Pond earlier this week. Montgomery Irrigation isolated this concern, allowing the irrigation system to work for the Avalon, The Gables and Child Development Center areas. However, the irrigation system supporting the Courtyard Apartments, Homes on the Green and Campbell Garden is affected by this main line leak. We are diligently working with Montgomery Irrigation to get this leak repaired as soon as possible.

## Facilities Updates

Over the next few weeks, there will be work on the Tower roof to repair some damaged roof and install two roof drains. There will be minimal impact to residents. Residents who will be directly impacted will be contacted individually.

We are trialing the replacement of water fountains with two water bottle filler fountains that have been installed near Cochrane Commons and Administration. We will look for feedback and consider replacing the remaining fountains.

Towards the end of next week, we plan to begin replacement of elevator ceilings and lighting. We will be installing stainless steel panels and LED lighting on the remaining elevators. Elevators in the Tower have already been completed.
