Coronavirus Update

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) positivity rate for Henrico County is currently 7.34%. This is an increase. Our region remains at a high community transmission level. Boosters are encouraged to help prevent the spread of coronavirus or severe illness. Experts continue to monitor the omicron variant. More data is needed to know whether it will cause breakthrough infections or severe illnesses. This week a Dining employee tested positive for COVID-19. This employee had been in quarantine due to the spouse testing positive. There is no risk of spread on campus.

There has been significant progress with the Parking Deck construction. A large crane is present to help with placing the precast panels. At the Parking Deck construction area, the road that passes the Mary Morton Parsons Health Center and Child Development Center loop will be closed to traffic on Saturday, December 11. Please use an alternate entrance to access these areas, such as the Avalon Entrance.

There has been good progress on the Promenade renovation including installing duct work and prepping the site for the concrete pour that will happen next week, both inside the building and for the new slab for the expansion. The concrete pad outside of the Promenade is currently being demolished to make way for the new slab, resulting in some noisy periods.

Holiday Scams

The holiday season is a busy time as we prepare for celebrations and shop for gifts. It is also a busy time for scammers as they devise ways to steal data through malicious email campaigns that can trick you into divulging personal information. Scammers will use email messages impersonating a brand, product or organization. The goal is to trick the recipient into believing that the email is legitimate and is of great interest or importance. The message will ask you to click on an attachment or link that will take you to a fake website that will try to steal your information.

Examples of some scams that have already started to make their way into residents' email are:

- Fraudulent shipping notifications - This type of email scam claims to be from UPS or FedEx and instructs you to click on a link to check the status of your shipment. The safest way to track packages is to go directly to the UPS or FedEx site and use your tracking number to track your package.
- Charity Frauds - This type of scam typically tries to trick the recipient into believing that they are donating money to a charity. The scammers are luring people to donate to charities that do not exist. This year, phishing campaigns are likely to exploit COVID-19 to convince people to donate to coronavirus-related charities. The safest way to donate online is to visit the website of a reputable charity and follow their directions for donations.
- Gift Cards - Scammers send out fake emails requesting personal information with promises of providing a gift card to popular businesses like Starbucks or Target. They may ask you to answer a brief questionnaire asking for your date of birth and other personal information. Be cautious of any email asking for personal information.
- IRS Scams - It is important to keep in mind the IRS generally does not initiate contact with taxpayers by email to request personal or financial information. This includes any type of electronic communication, such as text messages and social media channels. You can report any suspicious IRS message by visiting [IRS.gov](https://www.irs.gov) for additional information.

Please take care to protect yourself during the holiday season and throughout the year.
