COVID-19 Updates

The positivity rate for Henrico has reduced slightly to 31.5%.

Current Resident Cases of COVID-19

Many of our previously reported residents who tested positive for COVID-19 are now considered recovered. As of today, four Mary Morton Parsons Health Center residents are recovering in quarantine, with three of them being cared for in the COVID-19 Unit. One Independent Living resident and three Assisted Living residents are recovering in quarantine.

Thankfully, we are finding very few Independent Living positive cases. Thank you for the precautions you are taking that help keep you safe and healthy. It is working, so please keep it up. Those who have tested positive in Independent Living have recovered quickly.

Current Employee Cases of COVID-19

32 employees have tested positive for COVID-19 and are currently recovering in quarantine. They work in the following areas: Assisted Living, Dining, Facility Services, Finance, Parsons Health Center, Resident Services and Westminster Canterbury Richmond at Home. Many others have recovered and returned to work. Many others have symptoms and are out awaiting test results. We are encouraged that the number of cases is decreasing. 101 staff have tested positive since December 1.

Free COVID-19 Testing Kits

The federal government is offering free at-home COVID-19 tests for every household in the United States. Many residents have already requested these tests. If you are interested in placing an order, visit www.covidtests.gov. Every home in the U.S. is eligible to order 4 free at-home COVID-19 tests. Orders will usually ship in 7-12 days. There is a simple form to fill out with your name and address.

We encourage you to make this request if you are able. You may keep the kits for your use or reach out to the Clinic for assistance when you have symptoms and would like to be tested. You may also give the kits to Westminster Canterbury, and we will add them to our supplies for testing as needed. If you have questions, call Resident Services at 264-6082.

The government has also said that a phone number will be set up so that you can order tests via phone, but it is not known when that will be available. We will update you as we learn more.

Snow Updates
