### COVID-19 Updates

The positivity rate for Henrico is 22.57% this week. Our region remains at a high level of community transmission per the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC).

#### Current Resident and Employee Cases of COVID-19

In encouraging news, many of our previously reported residents who tested positive for COVID-19 are now considered recovered. As of today, two Mary Morton Parsons Health Center residents are recovering in quarantine. The last resident being cared for in the COVID-19 Unit returned to Parsons Health Center. The COVID-19 Unit is now closed.

There are no known cases among Assisted Living residents.

Last week we shared that we knew of no cases in Independent Living. Within two days, three Independent Living residents tested positive for COVID-19. Thankfully everyone is doing well, though they are not fully recovered yet. These individuals took quarantine guidelines seriously once they became symptomatic or knew that they had been exposed, so the risk to others is low.

Twelve employees tested positive for COVID-19 and are currently recovering in quarantine. A total of 119 employees tested positive since December 1. We are grateful to see the number of active cases decline.

Many residents are eager to get back to in-person activities. We are not ready to expand beyond what is currently being offered. Our staff teams have plans ready for easing back into certain programs and services when appropriate. We continue to actively monitor the situation and promise to keep you updated.

#### Vibrancy! and Other Construction Updates

There is a lot happening behind the scenes with construction of the Parking Deck and the Promenade expansion. Many have enjoyed watching as the precast panels are being installed on the Parking Deck. They expect to install the final panel on Wednesday, February 9, and remove the crane on Thursday and Friday, February 10-11. Work will continue on the electrical, plumbing, elevator and landscape elements. The Parking Deck is expected to be complete near the end of March or early April, depending on the weather.
